

Thank you...

...for your continued support in helping keep our school and community as safe as possible during the current times. Across Wales the introduction of face masks in the last week has been met within our school with great positivity, thank you.

We continue to experience an increased number of children having to self isolate and/ or have a test. Therefore we are continuing to ask for your support and be aware that if your child presents with COVID symptoms (cough, high temperature, loss of smell and/ or taste) and as a result has a test, please isolate them and your household until the result is received. On no account send your child back to school; even if they seem better in themselves.

We require confirmation of a negative test.

We continue to ask for your support in the number of items being brought into school. Items linked to learning are supported, stored and shared accordingly once safe. However, we have an increasing number of birthday gifts, cards, favourite items etc. that cannot be brought into school. If you are wishing to share gifts we ask for your cooperation by exchanging these outside of the school premises.

Anti-Idling

We continue to observe some visitors to the school grounds who despite the important message shared by our pupils leaving their engines idling/ running. Please support our children with their important message by switching off your vehicles when stationary/parked—please help to keep our air clean and save money.

Class Communication

<u>Reception:</u> Reception Class have had an eventful couple of weeks over the forest. Some of the children thought they had seen evidence of a fairy home, others believed a Troll lived under the little wooden bridge. Well who knows? However, we received a letter in the post from Ronnie the Robin and he had some photographs of a beautiful, graceful fairy and a handsome troll! Well, we thought he was. "Beauty is in the eye of the beholder" A gorgeous christmas tree appeared in our class this week. We think this might have something to do with Ronnie the Robin.

The frost was dazzling last week and we went on a walk to give us inspiration for a poem. The children came up with some interesting words to describe the frost.

We are going to be very busy this week making decorations to sell as part of our entrepreneurship. Details will follow.

<u>Year One:</u> Have been busy in the last couple of weeks completing an investigation about which surface the vehicle will travel the furthest along. They have continued to embrace the outdoors by making stars with treasure from forest school as well as decorating the 'Trellech Pew' with some special thankyou messages this Christmas. We had a special visitor to class who left us a special letter with a message from Father Christmas, we found Buddy in our sparkly tree. We were very excited to receive our class certificate for completing the London Mini Marathon as well as the news our designs and ideas for our outdoor area had been successful.

<u>Year Two:</u> Year 2 have had a really interesting two weeks! We have finished our 3D hot air balloons that look incredible! each and every child has worked very hard. In maths we have been focusing on division sharing numbers between each-other. Over in forest school the learners needed to figure out the sum to create a mystery word. All learners thrived in this task. Our forest school sessions have been investigating the meadow, we have searched for different mushrooms and also made frost angels. The next coming weeks we will be making lots of Christmas craft and practicing for our Nativity.

Year Three: In year 3 we have been learning how to use a number line for subtraction. We can do this by counting on from the smallest number or counting back from the largest. It has taken some getting used to but the pupils are getting more confident with this. It's always best to go the next or nearest 10 firstly. We have also played games using degrees of turn and learnt how to use our times tables to calculate division problems. In Literacy we have performed our pupil written scenes based on 'The Imagination Box' novel. Thanks for the costumes; the pupils looked great as their characters! We have also written a diary as an elf getting ready for Christmas; these were superb! The pupils have also written some fab Haiku poetry which originates from Japan.

The pupils made some great observations and conclusions related to our science experiment on dissolving and have written a paragraph about themselves in Welsh. Da lawn Year 3!!

Year Four: In Year 4 we have been continuing to work on our novel "The Explorer" by Katherine Rundell, watching interviews with her and writing her biography. The children found it fascinating to find out what motivates her and that she really has eaten grub pancakes like the characters in the book! We are hard at work making our product for the enterprise project, having calculated the potential profit we will make. Our ICT skills have been improving greatly through copying, pasting and editing pictures using Adobe Spark. It was wonderful to see everyone being able to crop pictures and understand why pictures need to be edited. We have also answered the question of "What is deforestation?" which provided us with lots of ethical questions to answer. Bendigedig Year 4.

<u>Year Five:</u> In Year 5 we have been making great use of our ICT skills this week! We have been recording news broadcasts using green screen to add in a background and iMove to edit video clips together. We also created interactive advent calendars to share with the other classes. We have been working hard on our Christmas Enterprise project, thinking about what items would sell well, designing items, finding out where we can buy our materials for best value, and working out how much we should sell for and what profit we could potentially make....phew!

We also enjoyed taking part in our Playmaker session on Thursday, finding out all about what makes a good leader, and how we can work effectively in a team to improve our games.

Year Six: Over the last 2 weeks Year 6 have been very busy in their learning. Last week we had an Art in Maths week where we learnt to draw cardioids,

used mosaics to find fractions, percentages and decimals, drew mazes, and created geometric patterns - we all had a lot of fun. We continued with our Rainforest topic and wrote a newspaper report based on our stories 'Lost in the Amazon'. We completed branching diagrams to classify animals using J2Data and had a go at drawing our own - which was more complicated than using the computer! This week we have been extremely busy researching, costing and advertising our Christmas Fayre items to sell at our Virtual Christmas Fayre - we really hope you will like our Christmassy items. PC Finnister has also visited us to talk about Cyber Bullying and Keeping Safe Online.

A special well done to <u>Foundation Phase</u> pupils and staff who have a beautiful Christmas window display in Monmouth (near Barclays Bank. We are very proud of all your hard work.
